IT IS AMAZING WHAT ONE YEAR CAN

BRING! When we began 2022, Mackie's Place was in search of a new home with an extremely tight timeline. In so many ways, we were facing the impossible; much like what our young crew faces each day as they experience lives filled abuse, human trafficking, and generational trauma.

Fast forward to the end of our fiscal year in June, Mackie's Place had secured a beautiful new home, we raised almost a quarter of a million dollars in our Capital Campaign, and never closed for a day, even in the midst of a year of consistent inconsistency.

We are so very proud and grateful that we were able to not only continue to care for our crew, but also expand our reach by pivoting into a multi-site model and grow many new incredible community partnerships. Additionally, we Church; this allows our alumni to bridge the gap between working within the walls of Mackie's Place and securing employment in the community. Our team and our crew are all the bandwidth to see young lives transform exponentially

Like most things in this world, there are challenges everywhere, every day, all the time that we must face. This last year has been a testament to the power of perseverance; the power of community; the power of *hope*! In some ways, it was a great test for us to be living examples of how to walk challenging paths with hope, authenticity, and tenacity.




FIVE YEARS of MACKIE'S PLACE

COMMUNITY COFFEE

IN SEPTEMBER 2022, WE OPENED COMMUNITY COFFEE, A FOR-PROFIT CAFE OPERATED IN PARTNERSHIP WITH RELATE CHURCH.

We are currently operating two days per week, Wednesdays and Thursdays, and employing 4 of our Job Skills Program alumni.

For older youth and young adults who have completed our Barista Skills program and need additional time and support before entering the general workforce, Community Coffee offers a safe and supportive environment where their emotional, cognitive, and social functioning are supported.

By bridging this gap, we see young people build healthy relationships, confidence, leadership skills, and *hope* for their future.

As Community Coffee continues to gain awareness and get busier, we will add additional days of operation, allowing us to employ more young people and increase our profit margins!

YOUTH STORY

"Just want to share a milestone with you. That I'm 1 year sober."

We met Max in the fall of 2020 because his partner was a barista at Mackie's Place. He'd completed one semester of culinary school and had a passion for cooking and serving people. He started working in our kitchen, but soon found himself in a terribly tough domestic scenario. His physical and mental health were deteriorating quickly, and our concern for him was mounting as the young man who rarely missed shifts was now habitually high and missing work.

We can't really say if it happened in a day, a week, or a month, but something shifted for Max. It was a year ago and it was fast. He could clearly see his desired direction and was making a change.

It was exhilarating watching the switch. He was alive, with a literal bounce in his step.

When we had to pivot and move out of our space, he was a huge piece of the development of a new kitchen space that could cater food to our drop-in locations. Before long, an offer came from our good friends at Joseph Richard Group and he was off to work with them full-time. We were thrilled; thankful for his contributions and for allowing us the privilege of walking his road out with him.

A year later, you'll occasionally find him on a Monday night at our drop-in. Now he is here volunteering after a day of work. He is developing his skills and still sharing them with us.

In December he sent the message above...

The first step in this process is completing the tenant improvements on our new Mackie's Place Headquarters!

We hope to have TI's complete in the Spring, providing us with a home base and a landing spot for all of our crew. Our Headquarters will include a full-scale commercial coffee shop, a bistro, a youth lounge, and office space for some of our staff. This space will provide ample opportunity for youth to join a Job Skills program and gain invaluable employment skills training in the coffee shop, bistro, or cleaning the hub.

WE ARE SO EXCITED TO HAVE A SPACE TO CALL OUR OWN THIS YEAR! A SPACE FOR OUR CREW TO CALL HOME; A SPACE TO GROW, TO LEARN, TO BUILD RELATIONSHIPS; AND, A SPACE TO WELCOME YOU, OUR WONDERFUL DONORS AND VOLUNTEERS, FOR COFFEE AND A TOUR.

This Spring, we are excited to have another young man graduate high school with the assistance of the Mackie's Place team! After dropping out of high school a few years ago, he made the decision in 2022 to return to school and complete his diploma. He has been working diligently with our staff to complete his online classes, as well as working in our kitchen to earn high school credits. We are so proud of him!

We are also anticipating another year of beautiful events for our youth, volunteers, and donors! AN UPDATE ON OUR NEW HOME

We are thrilled to have found a space for our Mackie's Place Headquarters! Our Headquarters will act as a fully-functional, FREE, youth-led bistro where there will be homemade meals, snacks, beverages, and smoothies served. With the support of many individuals and businesses, we are all set with beautiful plans and ready to execute on our Tenant Improvements as soon as our permits are granted.

Madeleine Sloback, of **Madeleine Design Group**, came alongside us in the early stages and has remained by our side, generously donating her time and expertise to design a beautiful bistro, youth lounge, and office space that will provide a safe and inviting second home for many at-risk youth in Surrey.


Chef Colin Burslem, Executive Chef at Joseph Richard Group, has been invaluable in sharing his wealth of knowledge in the hospitality and culinary world as we build out the bistro plans.

Benchmark Homes has jumped in as our contractor and is very generously donating their time and services in leading our construction.

If there is one skill we've learned as we have pioneered an organization, it is patience. The process of designing the space, acquiring permits, and raising \$250,000 for tenant improvements has been quite the adventure, and we are so grateful to have the best and most experienced team supporting us every step of the way.

2022 BEGAN WITH SOME EXTRAORDINARY AND CHALLENGING CIRCUMSTANCES AT MACKIE'S

PLACE! After managing to keep our doors open through COVID with crucial in-person connection, we received short notice that we would have to move our hub headquarters space. Finding space in North Surrey is very challenging on a two-month deadline, but as always, the board and staff of Mackie's Place were up to the challenge and committed to finding ways to serve our youth and prevent them from finding themselves in even more difficult circumstances.

We quickly got to work searching for a home, launching a capital campaign, and brainstorming how we could continue to care for our youth.

We are grateful to say we NEVER closed our doors for a day.
Instead, we quickly pivoted and moved to a multi-site model,
which included:

- Securing a leased space in the same neighborhood as our previous hub for our new hub headquarters, and undergoing the process of tenant improvements;
- Building brand-new partnerships with the City of Surrey, Relate Church and Cedar Grove Church;
- Partnering with Joseph Richard Group, who graciously shared space in two of their commercial kitchens, offering us the space rent-free! We are still operating out of the generous gift of their spaces, ensuring we can feed our youth homemade meals, and making it possible to keep our alumni employed and youth engaged in the job skills program.

The move, a shift in operations and need to raise an additional \$250,000 for tenant improvements meant that there was an abundance of administrative work to be done between programming, operations and fundraising. At the same time,

we had to scale back hours of operation to fit the availability of our new partners.

Our general administration, fundraising, and programming were affected by these circumstances. Although our programming hours were reduced, our other operational costs remained the same and our team worked tirelessly to restructure and regain stable ground.

What a challenging year for our entire team and our youth!

As Chair of the Board of Directors, I could not be more impressed by what has been accomplished by our dedicated and talented team. We were able to overcome adversity and our youth were able to be a part of this journey, offering them a valuable life lesson in perseverance, as well as confirmation of our commitment to them. It has been a great honour to walk this journey with them and with our faithful community of supporters.

We are currently awaiting permits to complete our new Mackie's Place hub headquarters. Mackie's Place hub will be a fully operationally FREE youth-led bistro and drop-in for at-risk youth in our city. We have the systems and processes in place and we are excited to continue serving the most vulnerable youth in our city! It is with great confidence that I am able to report that despite the challenges, we have a solid two-year plan in place enabling us to position ourselves for growth and expand opportunities for our youth to engage our transformational job skills and employment programs.


